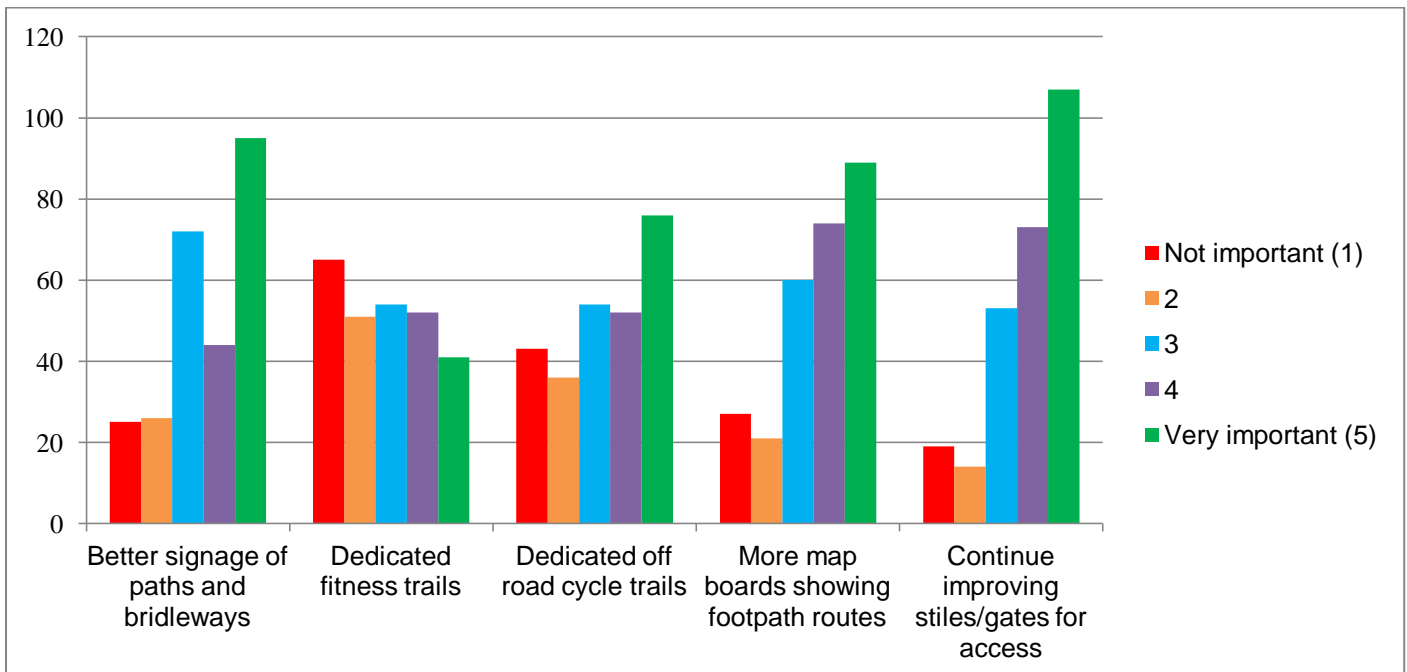

No more unsightly signage, please

Salt / grit bin because we are isolated in the winter when it snows! Parish Council rejected!

Boughton P.C. is not doing enough to secure and manage its Parish footpaths, nor providing litter bins or bus-stop shelters

Off road travel very poor

More litter and dog poo bins

Easier usage of Dunkirk woodland and hop garden walkways

To make sure all trail, footpaths, routes etc are kept cut back and accessible at all times

Existing pathway cut back so you can actually walk along them!

Tennis Court

Electric (disabled) scooter access past the school to Stockers hill pavement left hand side going down is not wide enough for a scooter

More drop kerbs for mobility scooters

Separate provision for walkers and cyclists and all footpaths maintain well maybe with volunteers to keep footpaths clear and accessible for old and young alike

Since moving to Boughton three years ago I have rarely used by bicycle because there is nowhere safe to cycle around here

Well done for keeping paths clear which previously farmers hadn't been maintaining. We appreciate your work on this

More salt bins on the hills

None

All of these litter the countryside with manmade materials and are usually ugly! Less signage is good

Street signs to be cleaned

Pathways need to be maintained for the elderly and disabled

More details of local Council Meetings

One way to attract families / tourism

Signage of paths and bridleways is already good

Keeping paths free of litter and overgrown weeds

Stop farm staff "threatening" dog walkers

Increase footpath access and keep clear of weeds and other growth

Clearance and maintenance of existing footpaths as many already abandoned and / or impassable. Recognition that this may have to be done at Parish level.

Open closed footpaths that local farmer has closed

Public toilets in Eastern end of Dunkirk

Bossenden Wood, - Cycle tracks and Fitness Course

I would like to see footpaths kept clear of brambles, nettles, etc

The facilities in this area would be best kept intact and more looked after by the RSPB

Cycle route to Faversham

None – I think it's pretty good – it would be good to cut back some of the vegetation a bit earlier in the season sometimes

Another salt bin in Dunkirk Village (Stoney Road)

The existing footpaths should be properly maintained before new facilities are added

Possible tea room / coffee shop and bakery

Wheelchair / mobility scooter trails

More dog litter bins – please, please

Wildlife information boards – would like to know what one might expect to find in the area eg reptiles, birds, mammals I expect its quite diverse

Would be nice to have gym equipment / out door fitness for all ages ie (as Littlebourne has) at Village Hall

All good

Children's play area in Dunkirk

Just better maintenance of footpath (many very over-grown)

Picnic areas
